GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. Regional BAGCAT Swimming Championships shall be competed for annually and subject to any standard the Technical Swimming Committee (TSC) may impose. The Championships shall be open to any member of a club affiliated to the ASA East Region who is eligible within the meaning of ASA Law
2. The age groups of competitors shall be: (ages as per the age qualifying date shown on the entry forms)
Individual Events:-
Boys 10,11,12,13 & 14 years Girls 10,11,12 & 13 years
Team Events:-
Boys 11 to 14 years Girls 11 to 13 years
3. All events shall have finals except the 400m, 800m and 1500m Freestyle and the 400m I.M. which shall be Timed Finals. 10,11,12,13 & 14 boys and 10,11,12 & 13 girls shall have individual age finals for all other events
4. Each Final shall have a maximum of two reserves declared. Athletes must compete in the heats to progress to the final
5. The 800m freestyle will be restricted to ten heats and the 1500m freestyle six heats. Both will be swum as mixed gender events
6. An athlete entered in the name of one club in the individual events may not compete in the name of another club in the team events. An athlete must be a member of the club in whose name he/she is entered and must have been registered as such with the ASA prior to the closing date of the competition
7. Entry times for 50m, 100m, 200m & 400m events shall be eligible for inclusion in the ASA Rankings database. Entry times for 800m & 1500m events may be achieved in other competition or time-trials. All times must have been achieved within the qualifying dates shown on the entry forms. Where entry to a 100m event is through a 200m qualifying standard, as indicated in the Qualifying Times, the 200m time achieved shall be entered, **NOT** a 100m time. The committee reserve the right to ask for proof of entry time. Subsequent improved times will not be accepted
8. Where a Club enters five or more competitors, entries shall be submitted electronically to the Entry Manager. ONE cheque payable to the ASA East Region or the bank transfer details shall be provided for the consolidated payment of all the entries. Any Club failing to meet either of these requirements will be subject to a £25 administration charge BEFORE entries are processed. The entry software may be downloaded from www.sportsys.co.uk. Entries from Clubs with less than five competitors shall be made on the official entry forms; however, Clubs are encouraged to submit entries using the same method as above. All electronic entries do not require a paper entry form to be submitted. It should be noted electronic entrants are still bound by the conditions of entry even though a form is not signed.
9. Entries shall reach the Entry Manager not later than the advertised closing date. Acknowledgement and acceptance of a correctly submitted entry shall be by publishing an accepted entry listing and draft programme on the Championship page at www.eastswimming.org
10. Dependent on the number of entries, the promoter reserves the right to reject the slowest competitors
11. Any athlete failing to comply with any of the foregoing conditions shall not be allowed to compete in the Championship
12. Warm Up will commence one hour before the start time
13. **There is NO secondary entry (card posting) in this competition but the competition will be deck seeded.** Notice of all withdrawals from a Club shall be reported by Clubs to the Recorders, located on the pool deck, at least 45 minutes before the start of the Session. An individual, **including reserves**, withdrawing from a final shall give notice of withdrawal to the Recorders within 30 minutes of the publication of the list of finalists. Withdrawals after the 30 minute deadline may only be made on medical grounds. **Failure to comply with these conditions shall result in a fine of £10, which must be paid before the competitor competes again in the Championships.** In the event of a competitor not paying the fine, the Club in whose name the competitor has entered the competition shall be responsible for payment
14. The first three competitors in each Championship Age Group shall receive a suitable award
15. Protests shall be made and dealt with as detailed in ASA Law. The promoter is the ASA East Region
16. Any question arising for which these conditions do not provide, shall be determined by the TSC
